Dear Secretary Brilling:

Pursuant to section 122 of the New York Public Service Law (PSL) and Part 85 of the Commission's Rules, Champlain Hudson Power Express, Inc. (CHPEI) respectfully submits the enclosed ten hard copies (nine copies and one original) and ten electronic copies on CD of its Application for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need (the Certificate) for the Champlain Hudson Power Express Project (the Application).

1. The Project

CHPEI proposes to construct, operate, and maintain a new 2,000 megawatt (MW) underwater/underground electric transmission system to be known as the Champlain Hudson Power Express Project (the Project). The Project will consist of two 1,000 MW High Voltage Direct Current (HVDC) circuits (bipoles) that would interconnect with the transmission system of Hydro-Quebec.

One circuit would extend approximately 319 miles from the Canadian border to Yonkers, New York, where it would connect with a converter station to be owned by CHPEI. CHPEI would also construct a 345 kV AC cable system running approximately 6.6 miles to a 345/138 kV substation that would connect this circuit to Con Edison's Sherman Creek substation in Manhattan. The other HVDC circuit would parallel the first circuit but would not exit the

Hudson at Yonkers and would instead continue underwater in the Harlem and East rivers into Long Island Sound, ultimately connecting to a converter station at Bridgeport, Connecticut.

By constructing these HVDC and HVAC lines to the maximum extent practicable either under the waters of Lake Champlain, the Champlain Canal and the Hudson River and under ground along established rail corridors, CHPEI has sought to mitigate most if not all of the adverse environmental impacts traditionally associated with the construction of new high voltage transmission lines. Further details concerning the Project route and construction details are provided in the Application and its Exhibits.

In particular, CHPEI requests that the Commission appoint a hearing examiner and authorize parties as soon as practicable and prior to July 1, 2010. CHPEI believes that there is much work that the parties can do prior to that date, including working out a procedural schedule, resolving issues involving intervenor funding, and commencing the discovery process as to those portions of CHPEI's Application that are already complete.

2. Request for Expedited Action to Accommodate DOE Loan Guarantee

CHPEI respectfully requests the Commission's assistance in expediting this proceeding to the maximum extent practicable to permit CHPEI to qualify for a \$2,300,000,000 loan guarantee (the Loan Guarantee) from the United States Department of Energy (DOE). By letter dated October 23, 2009, DOE made clear that in order for the Project to receive the Loan Guarantee, CHPEI must satisfy the stringent "commencement of construction" requirements no later than September 30, 2011. Accordingly, CHPEI respectfully requests that the Commission assist CHPEI to the maximum extent practicable in achieving this in-service deadline.

3. Data Gaps

While achievement of DOE's September 2011 commencement of construction deadline would be readily achievable if CHPEI had been able to develop a complete Article VII Application before DOE's loan guarantee program was announced, CHPEI's Application was still in the conceptual phase at that time. Since that time, CHPEI has struggled to make this Application as complete as possible, but has been hindered by winter weather from conducting surveying and sampling operations along the proposed right-of-way. In addition, the System Reliability Impact Study (SRIS) for the Project is still under development.

In order to permit CHPEI to submit this Article VII Application to the Commission at this time and to remedy the data gaps discussed above in a mutually-acceptable manner, CHPEI has developed a list of known data gaps in its Application, along with the additional materials that CHPEI proposes to submit either on July 1, 2010 or as part of the Commission's Environmental Management and Construction Plan (EM&CP) process. A copy of this list of known data gaps is annexed to this filing letter as Attachment A. In addition, Attachment A also establishes certain protocols to be followed by CHPEI in the preparation of that update filing.

In the event that the Commission finds that CHPEI's Application is incomplete or deficient in any ways other than those listed in Attachment A, CHPEI respectfully requests that the Commission or its Secretary notify CHPEI as soon as practicable, so that CHPEI may bring its Application into compliance with those requirements as quickly as possible.

4. Request for Confidential Treatment of Archeological Records

To the maximum extent practicable, CHPEI has sought to make all of the materials submitted in support of its Application available to the general public. However, in the course of preparing this Application CHPEI was required to obtain and analyze certain archeological records maintained by the State Historical Preservation Office (SHPO) which CHPEI is prohibited from releasing to the general public by the section 14.07(1)(f) of the New York State Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation Law, *see also* 9 N.Y.C.R.R. § 427.8 (2010). Accordingly, Appendix E of this Application, Historic and Archeological Resource Mapping and Tables, (Appendix E) has been redacted from the public version of this Application filed with the Commission and served on the parties.

By separate letter to Chief Administrative Law Judge Elizabeth H. Liebschutz, CHPEI has provided the Commission with an unredacted copy of Appendix E, along with a request that the Commission keep these materials confidential and exempt from public disclosure under New York's Freedom of Information Law (FOIL). A copy of this letter to Judge Liebschutz is annexed to this cover letter as Attachment B.

5. Intervenor Funding

CHPEI is aware that as a result of recent amendments, PSL § 122(5)(a) now provides that:

For every application deemed complete by the commission after the effective date of this subdivision, each application shall be accompanied by a fee in an amount equal to: for electric major utility transmission facilities of one hundred twenty-five kilovolts or more extending a distance of over one hundred miles, four hundred fifty thousand dollars

CHPEI is also aware that at its Session Meeting on March 25, 2010, the Commission approved Item No. 261 on its Consent Agenda involving amendments to the Commission's rules and regulations implementing PSL § 122. CHPEI anticipates that these revised rules and regulations, once they become publicly available, will make clear whether the payment obligation contained in PSL § 122(5)(a) becomes effective upon filing of an Article VII application or only upon a determination by the Commission that such application is complete.


Once the Commission has clarified the meaning of this statutory provision, CHPEI will file the \$450,000 fee established in this provision in compliance with the requirements of the Commission's rules and regulations, as amended.

6. Service

By agreement with your office, CHPEI is serving its complete application on all parties on CD due to the voluminous nature of the information contained therein, on the understanding that any party who requests a hard copy of that Application will be provided with one such copy. The Certificate of Service is annexed to this cover letter as Attachment C.

In addition, due to the high cost of producing multiple copies of the maps showing the full right-of-way of the Project at a scale of 1:24,000 for five miles on each side of the right-of-way along the 400 plus miles of the right-of-way in New York State, your office has further agreed that CHPEI may provide the Commission with one complete set of such maps, along with the GIS information from which such maps were printed.

Dear Judge Liebschutz:

Contemporaneous with the submission of this letter, Champlain Hudson Power Express, Inc. (CHPEI) is filing its Application for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need Pursuant to Article VII of the Public Service Law (Application) with the Secretary of the New York State Public Service Commission (Commission).

Pursuant to Section 6-1.4 of the Commission's Rules, 16 N.Y.C.R.R. § 6-1.4 (2010), CHPEI requests confidential treatment of the information contained in Appendix E to its Application, entitled Historic and Archaeological Resource Mapping and Tables (Appendix E). Because the entirety of Appendix E constitutes confidential information, CHPEI has redacted all of this appendix from the public version of its Application filed with the Secretary and served on the parties in this case. A complete copy of Appendix E is attached to this letter.

CHPEI therefore respectfully requests that the enclosed Appendix E be exempted from public disclosure under New York's Freedom of Information Law (FOIL) pursuant to Section 6-1.4 of the Commission's Rules, Section 87(2)(a) of the Public Officers Law, Pub. Off. L. § 87(2)(a) (McKinney 2010), and Section 14.07(1)(f) of the New York State Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation Law (McKinney 2010).

In determining whether information should be exempted from public disclosure under FOIL, section 6-1.3(b)(2) of the Commission's Rules requires the party seeking such exemption to provide a clear statement of the reason(s) why the information should be excepted from disclosure. Under Section 87(2)(a) of the Public Officers Law, confidential information protection is warranted if the information is "specifically exempted from disclosure by state or federal statute." Appendix E consists of bathymetric maps of the Hudson River Estuary which includes archeological information. As set forth in the State Historic Preservation Act codified in Article 14 of the New York State Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation Law (PRHPL), the State legislature has determined that "the historical, archeological, architectural and cultural heritage of the state is among the most important environmental assets of the state and that it should be preserved." PRHPL § 14.01.

Furthermore, with respect to the state register of historic places, Section 14.07(1) of PRHPL provides that:

(f) The commissioner (of parks, recreation and historic preservation) shall, upon request, provide information on the places listed on the state register and on sites included in the statewide inventory maintained by the office pursuant to the provisions of subdivision two of this section to any person making a written request for such information, *with the exception* of sites that may be damaged by unauthorized investigators if their location be generally publicized.

PHRPL § 14.07(1)(f) (emphasis added). *See also* 9 N.Y.C.R.R. § 427.8.


Similar protections are provided in federal law. *See, e.g.* 16 U.S.C. § 470hh (addressing confidentiality regarding the location of archaeological resources); 16 U.S.C. § 470w-3 (authority to withhold from disclosure information "about the location, character or ownership of a historic resource").

Therefore, under the Section (87)(2)(a) of the Public Officers Law, the entirety of Appendix E should be treated as confidential and exempted from public disclosure. Furthermore, pursuant to the Public Service Law Section 15, public officers are prohibited from disclosing any confidential information which may come to their knowledge during their employment. Pub. Ser. L. § 15 (McKinney 2010).

For the foregoing reasons, CHPEI requests that the attached documents, Historic and Archaeological Resource Mapping and Tables, as identified as Appendix E of CHPEI's Application, be deemed as confidential information, and therefore be protected from disclosure.




